Subject: Authorizing and Supporting a Grant Application through the USDA Forest

Service Urban & Community Forestry Program

As discussed with the City Council at the May 1, 2023, meeting, the U.S. Department of Agriculture Forest Service recently announced that grant applications are being accepted for Urban and Community Forestry funding that has been made available through the Inflation Reduction Act.

Staff is proposing a multi-faceted urban forestry project to apply for that would include the following:

- *Tree Planting.* Including planting by volunteers and contractors.
- *Tree Maintenance*. Including pruning and removal of existing trees, treatment of ash trees, and watering, mulching and pruning of newly planted trees.
- Tree Inventory and Management Plan. Including an inventory of existing trees and planting sites with risk assessment, a canopy assessment and a management plan.
- Community Outreach and Education. Including marketing and educational events with local schools and partnering organizations.

While we are still developing a detailed budget for the project, it is estimated that the total could be up to \$1 million.

While the grant program requires a dollar-for-dollar match, a match waiver is also possible for projects that deliver 100% of the funding/program benefits to disadvantaged communities. The project that is being proposed would be entirely located within disadvantaged areas of the City as defined by the Climate and Economic Justice Screening Tool and would thus be eligible for the match waiver.

We have met with the City's grant writer, LaBella Associates, D.P.C., to discuss the proposed grant opportunity and would propose that they write this application on the City's behalf. This would be the first grant written by LaBella Associates under our contract with them.

The attached resolution authorizes and supports a grant application through the USDA Forest Service Urban & Community Forestry Program in an amount up to \$1 million and directs the City Manager to apply on behalf of the City.

Tax Levy Limit Override: The City Council of the City of Watertown, County of Jefferson is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in General Municipal Law §3-c.

Severability: If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, individual, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjudicated by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Effective Date: This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.




The following sales tax data was obtained for NYS's quarterly taxable sales and purchases from March 1, 2013 through February 28, 2023 (https://data.ny.gov/). The State's sales tax data base is derived from more than three million data items reported on about 250,000 sales tax returns filed quarterly and on about 300,000 returns filed annually (statewide). The dataset categorizes quarterly sales and purchase data by industry group using the National American Industry Classification System (NAICS) (see Attachment A).

The first of the following tables summarize Jefferson County's cumulative taxable sales by NAICS sector for the periods March 1, 2013 – February 28, 2023, the first through third quarters of Fiscal Year 2022-23, Fiscal Year 2021-22 and Fiscal Year 2020-21. The second table shows the breakdown of the retail trade sector by the industry groups contained within it.

The following chart shows the relationship between gross taxable sales in Jefferson County and the resulting sales tax revenue to the City. The City receives 0.96% of each taxable sale (4.00% County sales tax rate times the 24.00% sales tax agreement with Jefferson County).



The following graph represents the twenty-five largest contributing categories to the City's sales tax revenue from March 2013 through February 2023.



#1. Automobile Dealers




#2. General Merchandise Stores, including Warehouse Clubs and Supercenters








NAICS classifies all economic activities into the following twenty categories.

- 11 Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting Activities of this sector are growing crops, raising animals, harvesting timber, and harvesting fish and other animals from farms, ranches or the animals' natural habitats. Establishments in this sector are often described as farms, ranches, dairies, greenhouses, nurseries, orchards, or hatcheries.
- 21 Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction Activities of this sector are extracting naturally occurring mineral solids such as coal and ore; liquid minerals such as crude petroleum; and gases such as natural gas; and beneficiating (e.g. crushing, screening, washing, and flotation) and other preparation at the mine site, or as part of the mining activity.
- **22 Utilities** Activities of this sector are generating, transmitting, and/or distributing electricity, gas steam, and water and removing sewage through a permanent infrastructure of lines, mains, and pipes.
- **23 Construction** Activities of this sector are erecting buildings and other structures (including additions); heavy construction other than buildings; and alterations, reconstruction, installation, and maintenance and repairs.
- **31-33 Manufacturing** Activities of this sector are the mechanical, physical, or chemical transformation of materials, substances, or components into new products.
- **42 Wholesale Trade** Activities of this sector are selling or arranging for the purchase or sale of goods for resale; capital or durable non-consumer goods; and raw and intermediate materials and supplies used in production, and providing services incidental to the sale of the merchandise.
- **44-45 Retail Trade** Activities of this sector are retailing merchandise generally in small quantities to the general public and providing services incidental to the sale of merchandise.
- **48-49 Transportation and Warehousing** Activities of this sector are providing transportation of passengers and cargo, warehousing and storing goods, scenic and sightseeing transportation, and supporting these activities.
- **51 Information** Activities of this sector are distributing information and cultural products, providing the means to transmit or distribute these products as data or communications, and processing data.
- **52 Finance and Insurance** Activities of this sector involve the creation, liquidation, or change in ownership of financial assets (financial transactions) and/or facilitating financial transactions.
- 53 Real Estate and Rental and Leasing Activities of this sector are renting, leasing, or otherwise allowing the use of tangible or intangible assets (except copyrighted works), and providing related services.

- **54 Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services** Activities of this sector are performing professional, scientific and technical services for the operations of other organizations.
- 55 Management of Companies and Enterprises Activities of this sector are the holding of securities of companies and enterprises, for the purpose of owning controlling interest or influencing their management decisions, or administering, overseeing, and managing other establishments of the same company or enterprise and normally undertaking the strategic or organizational planning and decision-making role of the company or enterprise.
- 56 Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services Activities of this sector are performing routine support activities for the day-to-day operations of other organizations.
- **61 Educational Services** Activities of this sector are providing instruction and training in a wide variety of subjects.
- **62 Health Care and Social Assistance** Activities of this sector are providing health care and social assistance for individuals.
- 71 Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation Activities of this sector are operating or providing services to meet varied cultural, entertainment, and recreational interests of their patrons.
- 72 Accommodation and Food Services Activities of this sector are providing customers with lodging and/or preparing meals, snacks, or beverages for immediate consumption.
- **81 Other Services (except Public Administration)** Activities of this sector are providing services not elsewhere specified, including repairs, religious activities, grant-making, advocacy, laundry, personal care, death care, and other personal services.
- **92 Public Administration** Activities of this sector are administration, management, and oversight of public programs by Federal, State and local governments.



Attachment A

NAICS classifies all economic activities into the following twenty categories.

- 11 Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting Activities of this sector are growing crops, raising animals, harvesting timber, and harvesting fish and other animals from farms, ranches or the animals' natural habitats. Establishments in this sector are often described as farms, ranches, dairies, greenhouses, nurseries, orchards, or hatcheries.
- 21 Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction Activities of this sector are extracting naturally occurring mineral solids such as coal and ore; liquid minerals such as crude petroleum; and gases such as natural gas; and beneficiating (e.g. crushing, screening, washing, and flotation) and other preparation at the mine site, or as part of the mining activity.
- **22** Utilities Activities of this sector are generating, transmitting, and/or distributing electricity, gas steam, and water and removing sewage through a permanent infrastructure of lines, mains, and pipes.
- **23 Construction** Activities of this sector are erecting buildings and other structures (including additions); heavy construction other than buildings; and alterations, reconstruction, installation, and maintenance and repairs.
- 31-33 Manufacturing Activities of this sector are the mechanical, physical, or chemical transformation of materials, substances, or components into new products.
- **42 Wholesale Trade** Activities of this sector are selling or arranging for the purchase or sale of goods for resale; capital or durable non-consumer goods; and raw and intermediate materials and supplies used in production, and providing services incidental to the sale of the merchandise.
- **44-45 Retail Trade** Activities of this sector are retailing merchandise generally in small quantities to the general public and providing services incidental to the sale of merchandise.
- **48-49 Transportation and Warehousing** Activities of this sector are providing transportation of passengers and cargo, warehousing and storing goods, scenic and sightseeing transportation, and supporting these activities.
- **51 Information** Activities of this sector are distributing information and cultural products, providing the means to transmit or distribute these products as data or communications, and processing data.
- **52 Finance and Insurance** Activities of this sector involve the creation, liquidation, or change in ownership of financial assets (financial transactions) and/or facilitating financial transactions.
- 53 Real Estate and Rental and Leasing Activities of this sector are renting, leasing, or otherwise allowing the use of tangible or intangible assets (except copyrighted works), and providing related services.

- **54 Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services** Activities of this sector are performing professional, scientific and technical services for the operations of other organizations.
- 55 Management of Companies and Enterprises Activities of this sector are the holding of securities of companies and enterprises, for the purpose of owning controlling interest or influencing their management decisions, or administering, overseeing, and managing other establishments of the same company or enterprise and normally undertaking the strategic or organizational planning and decision-making role of the company or enterprise.
- 56 Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services Activities of this sector are performing routine support activities for the day-to-day operations of other organizations.
- **61 Educational Services** Activities of this sector are providing instruction and training in a wide variety of subjects.
- **62 Health Care and Social Assistance** Activities of this sector are providing health care and social assistance for individuals.
- 71 Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation Activities of this sector are operating or providing services to meet varied cultural, entertainment, and recreational interests of their patrons.
- **72 Accommodation and Food Services** Activities of this sector are providing customers with lodging and/or preparing meals, snacks, or beverages for immediate consumption.
- **81 Other Services (except Public Administration)** Activities of this sector are providing services not elsewhere specified, including repairs, religious activities, grantmaking, advocacy, laundry, personal care, death care, and other personal services.
- **92 Public Administration** Activities of this sector are administration, management, and oversight of public programs by Federal, State and local governments.
