Subject; Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget Resolutions, Ordinance, and Local Law

Attached for City Council consideration are resolutions associated with the adoption of the Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget.

The first resolution approves the City's Operating Budgets for the upcoming fiscal year. The changes made to the Proposed Budget by the City Council are attached to the resolution.

The second resolution establishes the Property Tax Rate for Fiscal Year 2023-24 at \$8.7871 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. This represents no change to the property tax rate from the current year. The property tax levy of \$9,903,017 represents a \$138,500 or 1.42% increase from the current year.

The third resolution approves the Capital Program Budget for Fiscal Years 2023-24 through 2027-28.

The fourth resolution establishes the fees and charges for the upcoming fiscal year.

The fifth resolution establishes the Annual Rates of Pay for Management Employees for the Fiscal Year 2023-24. The Proposed Budget included funds for a 3.75% cost of living increase.

An ordinance has been included to establish the water rates for the upcoming fiscal year. The Fiscal Year 2023-24 Water Fund Budget contains an increase of ten percent (10.00%) to all water rates.

A local law has been included to establish the sewer rates for the upcoming fiscal year. The Fiscal Year 2023-24 Sewer Fund Budget contains an increase of ten percent (10.00%) to the general sewer usage rates. A public hearing is required before voting on the local law. Staff is recommending that the public hearing be scheduled for June 19, 2023 at 7:15 p.m.

appropriations for the several funds in the Budget for 2023-24 will be amended as indicated in the Fiscal Year 2023-24 Detail of Changes in Revenues, Expenditures and Fund Balance Appropriations to the Proposed Budgets, which detail is attached and made a part of this resolution,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Watertown, New York that it hereby adopts the Budget for the City Government for Fiscal Year 2023-24 in the total amount of \$74,910,999 of which in the General Fund \$42,422,137 is to be raised by estimated revenues other than real property taxes, \$2,095,077 is to be appropriated from fund balance, \$4,459 is to be appropriated from the sidewalk program reserve, \$11,400 from the debt reserve, \$20,089 is estimated to be received from omitted taxes and \$9,882,928 is to be raised by the real property tax levy. In adopting the Budget, the City Council hereby appropriates \$74,910,999 for all operating funds, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in adopting the Budget, the City Council hereby appropriates \$10,750,375 for all reserve funds, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in adopting the Budget, the City Council approves the Fiscal Year 2023-24 Detail of Changes in Revenues, Expenditures and Fund Balance Appropriations to the Proposed Budgets, which is attached and made a part of this resolution.
