Subject; Fiscal Year 2025-26 Budget Resolutions

Attached for City Council consideration are resolutions associated withthe adoption of the Fiscal Year 2025-26 Budget.

The first resolution approves the City's Operating Budgets for the upcoming fiscal year. The changes made to the Proposed Budget by the City Council are attached to the resolution.

The second resolution establishes the Property Tax Rate for Fiscal Year 2025-26 at \$10.2700 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation which represents an increase of \$0.8624 per \$1,000 of assessed value or 9.17% from the current year. The property tax levy of \$11,518,551 represents a \$875,479 or 8.23% increase from the current year.

The third resolution approves the Capital Program Budget for Fiscal Years 2025-26 through 2029-30 and includes the funding changes for various projects.

The fourth resolution establishes the fees and charges for the upcoming fiscal year.

The fifth resolution establishes the Annual Rates of Pay for Management Employees for the Fiscal Year 2025-26. The Proposed Budget included funds for a 3.00% cost of living increase. In addition to the cost of living increase the following position grades have been changed:

An ordinance has been included to establish the water rates for the upcoming fiscal year. The Fiscal Year 2025-26 Water Fund Budget contains an increase of three percent (3.00%) to all water usage rates.

A local law has been included to establish the sewer rates for the upcoming fiscal year. The Fiscal Year 2025-26 Sewer Fund Budget contains an increase of three percent (3.00%) to the general sewer usage rates. A public hearing is required before voting on the local law. Staff is recommending that the public hearing be scheduled for June 16, 2025 at 7:15 p.m.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Watertown, New York that it hereby adopts the Budget for the City Government for Fiscal Year 2025-26 in the total amount of \$79,068,547 of which in the General Fund \$43,819,033 is to be raised by estimated revenues other than real property taxes, \$3,000,000 is to be appropriated from fund balance, \$4,459 is to be appropriated from the sidewalk program reserve, \$14,752 is estimated to be received from omitted taxes and \$11,503,799 is to be raised by the real property tax levy. In adopting the Budget, the City Council hereby appropriates \$79,068,547 for all operating funds, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Watertown, New York that §253-17 of the City Code of the City of Watertown is modified to read as follows:

- C. Rates.
- (1) The basis for the normal sewer service charge shall be the volume of water consumed from the Public Water Supply System by the individual property owner. The rates for both domestic and industrial metered sewer service within the City of Watertown shall be as follows:
- (a) Quarterly meter rates:

First 1,200 cubic feet (8,976 gallons)	\$41.91 per 1,000 cubic feet (7,480 gallons)

- A.(1) Six cents (\$0.060) per gallon for all sewage, septage and slurries less than or equal to 5.6% solids by weight.
- A.(2) For all leachate: six cents (\$0.060) per gallon.
- A.(3) Thirteen cents (\$0.13) per pound (dry weight) for all deliveries over 5.6% solids by weight.
- A.(4) Minimum charge of \$43.22 per delivery.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the Sewer Service Charges shall be instituted with the sewer bills dated on or after July 1, 2025 and contained on all bills, and
