Engineering Department:

Barben Avenue / Holcomb St. / Bugbee Dr. and East St. Water Main Replacement:

The new Water Main and services on East Street have been installed and tested along with the new services on Holcomb Street from Mullin Street to Ten Eyck Street. A Change Order was made for additional paving work in these areas and sent to the City Council for approval at their 10-02-2023 meeting. EDGE Civil Corporation has graded and paved both roads, and are currently working on site restoration. Once complete, a final walkthrough for this project will be held.



City Hall Court Elevator Replacement:

A bid package to replace the elevator at City Hall was made, and this project is now out to bid.

Division St East / Thompson St Water Main Replacement Projects:

Barton and Loguidice has completed their as built drawings for this project, and the Engineering Department is currently in the process of closing out this project

DRI Streetscape Project:

CCI Companies has completed the road paving for this project and has begun milling and paving the crosswalks.

Fire Station Renovations:

Construction for this project began on October 9, 2023.



Flower Memorial Library Cornice Repointing:

A Notice to proceed has been sent to Heritage Masonry. This project is currently in the submittal phase and will begin work in the spring of 2024.

Franklin Street ADA Ramps:

Bids for this project were opened on September 25, 20023 and City Council accepted the bid from On Point Excavation & Consulting LLC as the contractor at their October 2, 2023 meeting.

Hydro Plant Concrete:

The contractor has completed the concrete piers, they plan to re-water the canal in the next few days.

Massey St / Coffeen St. / Court St. Project:

The deck of the Court Street bridge is complete and the contractor is installing the expansion joints and bearings for the bridge. Paving on Massey Street began September 27, 2023.

Water Treatment Plant COAG Generator Replacement:

The new concrete pad for the generator has been installed along with the new electrical conduit.

Vanduzee Street Bridge:

The contractor has poured the fascia and reattached the guard rails on the bridge, and have begun spot-repairing the south bound lanes of the bridge. Once complete, the contractor will begin work on the north bound lanes.



City Manager's Status and Information Update

Washington St / Keyes Ave 500 Block Sewer:

JL Excavation has installed the new sewer laterals on Keyes Avenue, and has tested the new manhole. JL Excavation is now installing the new sewer main on Washington Street. The new manhole has also been tied into the live sewer.



William J. Flynn Pool and Bathhouse Rehabilitation:

Con Tech Building Systems has poured the concrete for the new pool's floor and are creating the forms for the pool's walls. Once complete, Con Tech Building Systems will install the shotcrete for the walls. Blackstone Electric has removed most of the old wires in the Pool Mechanical Room, and Hyde Stone has begun uninstalling and removing the old ductwork. A Change Order for an electrical panel was approved by the City Council at their October 2, 2023 meeting, and a progress meeting was held on October 3, 2023.


We Congratulate our City representatives from the WWTP, on a job well done!


While half the academy class participated in firearms training, the other half was in EVOC training.


