

Engineering Department:

Burlington Street Reconstruction:

The City Engineering, Planning, DPW, and Water Departments have submitted their reviews for this project to Aubertine and Currier, and Aubertine and Currier is now using those to complete their design.

Fire Station Exhaust Capture Removal System:

The Contractor has begun construction for this project and has completed the demolition of the existing system. The contractor is now installing the rails for the new system.



Fire Station Renovations:

The new roofs over the porticos are complete, and the only remaining work is flooring at the State Street Fire Station. Once complete, a final walkthrough will be held.





Manhole Relining Project:

The minor punch list items for this project have been completed, and construction for this project is complete. The Engineering Department is in the process of closing out this project.

New York State has executed the eminent domain for this project and has sent the Engineering Department the agreement for this.

William J. Flynn Pool and Bathhouse Rehabilitation:

Con Tech Building Systems has installed all of the new hard ceilings, and all of the new interior walls have been installed. Con Tech Building Systems will begin painting the Bathhouse interior next week. The new concrete pads in the Mechanical Room have been poured and the forms removed, and the new chemical tanks have arrived. Sundance Leisure has begun installing the new filtration piping in the Mechanical Room. Hyde-Stone has installed all of their plumbing and mechanical pipes and ductwork in all of the bathhouse except for the Mechanical Room, and Blackstone Electric has begun pulling wires.





Police Department:

Domestic Violence Stabbing:

At about 8:29 am on Tuesday, February 6th, Watertown Police patrols responded to 1121 State Street in reference to a report of a stabbing. Officers arrived at the scene to find the victim of the stabbing, bleeding from a wound on her left side, at which point an officer applied pressure to the wound until relieved by Guilfoyle Ambulance personnel. The victim was transported to SMC with what was later found to be non-life-threatening injuries. The suspect, Lanasia R. Scott, age 18, was arrested in the area a short time later. She was charged with assault in the second degree (class "D" felony) and criminal possession of a weapon in the fourth degree (class "A" misdemeanor). She subsequently spit on a police officer and was additionally charged with harassment in the second degree (violation). Miss Scott was processed and held pending arraignment on the charges. The victim was Miss Scott's stepmother, making the incident a domestic violence case.

Reckless Endangerment/ Menacing:

At about 10:00 pm on Thursday, February 1st, Watertown Police patrols were called to the 7-Eleven store, located at 430 Factory Street, in reference to a large fight, involving a knife. Upon arrival, WPD patrols spoke to witnesses and reviewed a security video. The investigation led to the arrest of Marcos A. Aguayo, age 52, of 114 Franklin Street in Watertown. Aguayo was charged with reckless endangerment in the first degree (class "D" felony), criminal possession of a weapon in the third degree (class "D" felony) and menacing in the second degree (class "A" misdemeanor). Aguayo was processed and held for arraignment.

Police Academy:

The 2023-2024 session of the Black River/St. Lawrence Valley Police Academy "Basic Course for Police Officers" class is now in its 22nd week of training. During the past two weeks, recruits have been training in Environmental Conservation Law, the laws of arrest, physical fitness/wellness, electronic communication, defensive tactics, evidence collection, active shooter response, commercial vehicle enforcement, NY Penal Law, accusatory instruments, and the "Breath Analysis Operator" course. There are only five weeks of classes left before the police recruits begin working the road during the Field Training Program.


Visitors:




Planning Department:

Black River Trail Western Extension:

<u>Urban Forestry – Annual Winter Tree Pruning Project:</u>

The City's 2024 Young and Small Tree Pruning Project began the week of January 9. This annual project divides the city into three project areas, Northside, Westside, and Eastside Project Areas. Each work area is pruned once every three years, as part of this annual project. In coordination with City Planning Staff, the Department of Public's Works Buildings and Grounds crew will provide pruning for all trees with trunk diameters of 9" or less. Target trees will be pruned for vehicle and pedestrian clearance, structural improvements, and public safety. The pruning project is expected to run from mid-January through mid-April. This year's project takes place primarily in the City's Eastside neighborhoods and the Eastside of Thompson Park. Examples of streets, parks, and other City owned properties on this year's winter pruning list include Burchard Street, Hamilton St. N, Hamilton Street Playground, Thompson Blvd, Winslow Street, various City owned facilities and parking lots.


