

<u>Police Department:</u>

Community Event:

On 02/16/24 WPD along with other local and state law enforcement agencies participated in the Watertown Wolves Law Enforcement Appreciation game with a small parade around the ice and a ceremonial puck drop by Lt. Cristin O'Brien.







Patrol Division:

On 02/21/24, members of "C" Platoon responded to 518 Pine St for a reported subject damaging property within the residential facility, armed with a hatchet. Upon patrol arrival, the shift stacked up

and entered the facility with lethal and less-than-lethal options deployed. A call-out was performed and the subject entered the narrow hallway, armed with a hatchet and large hunting-style knife. He then struck a door with the hatchet and then threw the hatchet down the hallway towards officers. The subject then dropped the knife at his feet and then began to comply with verbal commands and patrols advanced down the hallway, and after a brief struggle took the subject into custody without further incident. Criminal charges to include reckless endangerment, weapons possession, resisting arrest and criminal mischief are pending. The subject was taken to SMC under MHL 9.41.

On 02/20/24 Members of "A" Platoon assisted WFD and GEMS with an unconscious/unresponsive individual. They were transported to SMC for evaluation.

Police Academy:

The 2023-2024 session of the Black River/St. Lawrence Valley Police Academy "Basic Course for Police Officers" class is now in its 24th week of training. During the past two weeks, recruits have been training in NY Penal Law, accusatory instruments, NY Public Health Law, human trafficking, defensive tactics and principles of control, NY Juvenile Law & procedure, traffic direction & control,

physical fitness & wellness, eyewitness identification, and fundamental crisis intervention for law enforcement. There are only three weeks of classes left before the police recruits begin working on the road during the Field Training Program. WPD recruit officers along with Officer Shane Ryan and Detective Matt Preedom sang the national anthem at the Watertown Wolves game.









Snow Clean-up:

DPW continuously picks up snow from the downtown/Public Squre area after each storm. Snow removal like this inproves sight conditions for the traveling public, gains back parking area from snow banks, and improves the width of usable walking area on the sidewalks. Whenever possible we also try to work our way out to secondary streets to eliinate snowbanks. This helps with possible drainiage issues down the road.



Storm Clean-up:

DPW crews were out again after storm Finn cleaning up. This storm created a massive amount of work. The crews ae utilizing the good weather for the weak to continue picking up debris from underutilized access roads and up at Thompson Park. DPW will be continuing cleaning up well into the spring.

Water Treatment Plant COAG Generator Replacement:

The new generator for this project arrived on site, however a panel was damaged during shipping. The generator is currently being inspected to see if the damage is only cosmetic and did not impact any of the electrical work inside. A new panel has been ordered.





William J. Flynn Pool and Bathhouse Rehabilitation:

Con Tech Building Systems has installed the rest of the interior Bathhouse ceiling, and all of the interior walls have been painted. The new doors are currently being installed, and Con Tech Building systems will be installing the new tile next week. Blackstone Electric has installed most of the new ceiling lights and exit signs.

Thompson Park Golf Course:

City Manager's Status and Information (Ipdate February 23, 2024 <u>Water Department:</u>



Water Treatment:

The WTP Door Replacement project is near completion with all but a few details to complete before closeout. Nine large, steel, double service doors were replaced as part of this project.

Dudley Construction has set the new COAG (coagulation) generator in place with work to make final connection ongoing.

Wastewater Treatment:

Contractors have completed the installation of a level and communication upgrade at the Fairbanks lift station. Lift stations are strategically positioned throughout the city at lower points to facilitate the pumping of water to higher elevations, enabling the natural flow of water through gravity.



The operators conducted repairs on the biosolids conveyor to ensure the effective removal of solids from our water treatment process. These solids, generated as a byproduct, are then applied to local farm fields as class B biosolids.






Operators, maintenance personnel, and trainees collaborated to remove, modify, and install a new pump at the Gaffney Dr. lift station. Given its status as one of the higher flow stations, the Gaffney Dr. station necessitates the redundancy of two pumps to ensure continuous operation.

During the event, she contributed to an operator forum by sharing insights on public outreach and operator engagement. 



Water Distribution:
