Street Closures and Construction


2024 Construction season is wrapping up with the following projects to be completed within the next month:

Police Academy:

The Black River/St. Lawrence Police Academy Class of 2024-2025 commenced on Monday, September 9, 2024, at Jefferson Community College. The academy class includes five officers from the Watertown Police Department and officers/deputies from the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, the Lewis County Sheriff's Office, the Fulton Police Department and the Manlius Police Department. The new officers will attend classes and practical exercises during a six- month academy. They will then transition to the "Field Training" portion of the academy before graduating and going out on the road on their own in the Summer of 2025. Good luck to the new recruits!

Fire Department

Station Upgrades and Grant Projects:

The Watertown Fire Department has several station upgrades and grant projects that are in motion. The DPW and Electrical departments are working on rebuilding our front apron and lighting at the Massey St Fire Station. Simultaneously the LED, fire prevention sign project is underway. The sign is funded by the Fire Prevention portion of





the federal assistance to firefighter's grant. Soon, the delipidated exterior entry doors at all three stations will be replaced, aided by funds through a DASNY grant.


9/11 Ceremony at Jefferson Community College:

The Watertown Fire Academy recruits participated as the color guard for the 9/11 ceremony at Jefferson Community College on September 11, 2024. There were several service organizations represented at the event, and it turned out to be an educational, honorable and humbling experience for the recruit class.



Department Training:

The Watertown Fire Department has been participating in training related to the replacement of our current records management system. The new system provides a more technologically advanced and user-friendly method to deal with day-to-day record keeping along with required fire and EMS reporting.

Planning Department

Thompson Park Bandstand Roof ReBid:



The City has been working with the Thompson Park Bandstand Roof Committee to construct and install a roof on the bandstand located at Thompson Park. Capital Construction & Development Corp. has been selected as the contractor for this project. The project will include the installation of an approximately 1,550 square

foot wood frame roof over the existing bandstand, and the potential for additional upgrades.

Fencing around the site has been installed, and tree protection will be going up this week. The work on the project is expected to start the week of September 16th and be completed by the end of October. The extended construction time is due to the current wait time for materials. During the extent of the project, parts of the sidewalk surrounding the site may be closed due to equipment and materials. The funds for this project have been raised by the Thompson Park Bandstand Committee, along with some funds that were committed by the City Council.

Public Square Fountain Restoration:

Robinson Iron, Inc. has been continuing to progress on the restoration and repainting of the Public Square Fountain. The restoration and repainting is nearly complete with the reinstallation of the fountain expected to occur during the week of September 16, 2024.

Thompson Park West Sector Trail Project:

Work will be starting the week of September 16th on this project that includes the construction of a new walking trail starting at the North Outlook (located along the Franklin St. Entrance) across the bottom of the North Down (Kite Hill) and along a portion of the west entrance drive adjacent to the golf course, connecting to the Rotary Fitness Trail. The City's contractor for the project, Barrett Paving, expects the project to be substantially complete by the end of October.

Huntington Island Police Training Facility Storm Clean Up:

Eighteen (18) trees were removed at the City Police Department training facility on Huntington Island. The affected trees were blown down or structurally compromised due to intense storms earlier this year. The City Contracted B&R Tree Experts to remove trees and large woody debris that came down across the smaller training range, and/or threated the primary range and classroom structure. The project has opened up the secondary range to allow for improved training opportunities.



Parks and Recreation Department



Department of Public Works

Electrical updates:



DPW electricians have been out replacing old inefficent parking lot lights with new LED. These new LED's are not only better on electric usage, they also provide more lighting coverage. Electricians are also out maintaing City infrastructure that have been damaged.



Storm Damage:

DPW has been out during the past few weeks repairing damage done from the recent storm events we have had. Although the city did not see as much damage as our surrounding communities, it still took a toll on our infrastructure pointing out flaws that need to be corrected soon.





Fire Department Infrastructure Reconstruction:



DPW crews started a new project at South Massey FD to replace the old deteriorated parking lot and concrete. Project will take a couple months but the end result will result in better drainage and better access for the Fire Department.



Winter Prep:

DPW has started winter preparations:



Zambonis being serviced for another year of ice.

Plow trucks are being serviced and general repairs are underway.

The central garage starts preparing for winter during summer which is quite normal and is expected to be completely ready for the first snowfall!



Street Construction:



DPW is working on wrapping up the 2024 construction season with the various street/site projects we had going. A lot of hard work has been done and with the weather the way it was, the schedule tightened up as added work from storms needed to be completed too.

Water Department

Water Treatment:

A stakeholder meeting is scheduled for September 12th, to discuss design and progress of the DBP Project. Town of Watertown, Town of Pamelia, DANC, NYSDOH, Army at Fort Drum, South Side Water, & GHD (engineering firm), generally attend these meetings.

The Department learned that the DBP Project was not selected for a DCIP (Defense Community Infrastructure Program) grant. It is unclear if we will be able to reapply in 2025.

Also, for the DBP Project, the city is applying for a \$3 million NBRC (Northern Border Regional Commission) grant.

Wastewater Treatment:
