

If there is a holiday on Monday, the Council Meeting or Work Session will take place on the following day, Tuesday. Public is welcome to attend all meetings. Police Academy:

The Black River/St. Lawrence Police Academy Class of 2024-2025 is now in the ninth week of classes. Over the past two weeks, the recruits have been training in topics such as: cultural diversity/bias-related incidents and sexual harassment, standards of proof, evidence concepts, decision making, ethics & professionalism, vehicle & traffic law, victim & witness services, discretionary powers, vehicle stops & traffic enforcement, arrest processing, case law, intoxication and observation & patrol. Classroom and practical training will continue through the end of March 2025, followed by 14 weeks of field training that will lead to graduation and certification through the NY State Division of Criminal Justice Services, Bureau for Municipal Police. Fire Department

City of Watertown Firefighters placed their lunch and dinner orders for on-duty personnel

Recruit Firefighter Academy:



Another week of recruit training is completed. This was a busy week that involved their third live burn, auto extrication certification and wildland fire training. Recruits are scheduled to graduate on December 6, 2024.

Water Rescue Event:



On October 31, 2024, WFD units were requested by the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office to assist with a sailboat stranded on a sand bar in Black River Bay. The boat had two occupants onboard and the sheriff's boat was unable to get to them due to there only being one foot of water. We responded with

the water rescue trailer to the Village of Dexter public boat lunch. Two boats with a total of 5 personnel were able to get to the stranded vessel and remove the occupants one at a time due to boat draft. Occupants were transferred to the sheriff's boat and safely brought to shore. No injuries were reported.

Planning Department

Fair Housing Education Sessions:

CNY Fair Housing, the City's qualified Fair Housing enforcement agency, will host two in-person Fair Housing Education Sessions on Thursday, December 5, 2024 at the Watertown Urban Mission. Pre-registration will be encouraged, but not required.

Information on how to register, as well as exact start times will be announced later this month. CNY Fair Housing will be presenting new material from previous years' classes, which will reflect updates in Fair Housing law with an emphasis on practical application.

Fall Tree Planting Projects:

The City's 2024 fall tree planting program included the planting of **88** trees as part of several contracted tree planting projects, and a large volunteer tree planting event.

Annual Fall Volunteer Tree Planting Event:

On Saturday, November 2, 2024, at 9:00 a.m., Tree Watertown hosted the City's 23rd Annual Fall Volunteer Tree Planting Event. This year's project included the planting of **51** trees at various locations along Grant Street, Seward Street, Henry Street, Starbuck Avenue, and the grounds of Starbuck Elementary School. Over 40 volunteers included Tree Watertown members; students, parents, and faculty of Watertown City School District (WCSD) and Immaculate Heart Central Schools (IHC); City staff; Department of Environmental Conservation staff; and other area partners. This project was part of the final touches of a multi-year street reconstruction, in addition to other various neighborhood improvement projects.

Trees and other supplies for the project were funded through the City's successful grant application through the *Northern New York Community Foundation's (NNYCF)* <u>Carolyn Whitney Tree Fund</u>. City DPW Buildings and Grounds team supported the event by organizing tools and supplies, preparing planting sites for volunteers, and will provide weekly watering throughout the 2025 growing season.

Tree Watertown members would like to acknowledge the following project donors: *State Street Hardware* for their donation of mulch for the event, and *Burrville Cider Mill* for refreshments.

Fall Contracted Tree Planting Projects:

Thirty-seven (**37**) trees were planted as funded by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and the City.

- <u>Thompson Park West Sector Trail Project</u> 17 trees.
- <u>Washington Street Tree Replacement Project</u> 13 trees.
- <u>Winslow Street Watermain Project</u> 7 trees.

DPW sewer crew completing a sewer lateral repair on Haley Street.






Salt Storage Building:




