

The City Council meets the 1st and 3rd Monday of each month at 7 PM in the Council Chambers, 3rd Floor, 245 Washington St, Watertown NY. The 2nd Monday of each month is held for Work Sessions, which are open discussions of topics requested by the Mayor and City Council. If there is a holiday on Monday, the Council Meeting or Work Session will take place on the following day, Tuesday. Public is welcome to attend all meetings. City Council Minutes & Agendas are available online and the Meetings and Work Sessions are captured on video by Steve Weed Productions.

Police Department

Kidnapping Arrest:

On 01/06/2025, members of our uniformed patrol division investigated a missing person report in the City of Watertown, NY. Our officers developed information that the missing 13-year-old female had been kidnapped by an unknown male. The case was further investigated by our criminal investigation division. It was determined that the juvenile female was picked up by Keller Singleton from Rome, GA. It was determined that Keller, through the use of social media, assisted the female in running away and planned to take her back to his home in Rome, GA for sexual purposes. The female was located in Marion, VA where Keller had left her. Keller was located by the Virginia State Police nearby in Chilhowie, VA where he was taken into custody.

Keller Jack Singleton, an 18-year-old male, who resides at 145 Shadow Lane SW in Rome, GA was placed under arrest and held on an arrest warrant signed by the Honorable Judge David Renzi of Jefferson County Court for Kidnapping in the first degree, a Class A Felony. He was extradited to Watertown, NY and appeared in Jefferson County CAP Court on 01/22/2025 where he was remanded to the Jefferson County Correctional Facility. Additional charges are possible pending Grand Jury action.

We strongly encourage parents to monitor their children's online activity and social media usage for the potential harm that can be caused by people the children may encounter on the internet with harmful intent.

Police Academy:

The Black River/St. Lawrence Police Academy Class of 2024-2025 is now in the twentieth week of classes. Over the past few weeks, the recruits have been training in topics such as: DWI detection and standardized field testing, defensive tactics, report writing, physical fitness & wellness, appearance tickets, extreme risk protection orders (ERPOs), standardized response plans for unusual events, and reality-based training.

During the police academy DWI detection and standardized field-testing training, recruit officers practiced administering the HGN (Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus) test.

Training:

Recently, fire department personnel have been busy with hazardous materials in-service training. This training is essential for maintaining the readiness and expertise of our team, enhancing our ability to respond swiftly and effectively to incidents involving hazardous substances, helping ensure the safety of residents in the City of Watertown, Jefferson County, and Lewis County. By staying up to date on the latest techniques, equipment, and protocols, we

Hydrants:

Department of Public Works

DPW crews took advantage of some clear weather conditions to ditch out areas along Olmsted Drive. It is important to maintain these areas even in cold weather to manage conditions come spring time.



Snow Town USA:



DPW crews worked with Parks and Recreation to close Park Circle and areas surrounding Thompson Park Entrance for the annual Snow Town USA event. This almost month long event showcases Watertowns historic weather conditions, with many events, vendors, and commnuity spirit the entire family can enjoy.

Central Garage Maintenance:

DPW crews work around the clock to keep plows and winter equipment running smoothly. Equipment is always rotating through the garage with various issues, and our crews are dedicated to keeping these machines on our roads running safely.



Special Visitors:

Local law enforcement was able to escape the recent below zero temperatures and train their K-9 units on the DPW campus. These highly trained canines showed off their skills with exercises throughout our various floors and extensive layout. Of course, with a reward of a toy at the end. Good Dog Alert!





Water Department



Operators at the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) replaced the hot water pumps for Primary Digester #2's heat exchanger. The digesters play a crucial role in stabilizing biosolids, making them suitable for beneficial reuse. Experienced staff used this maintenance project as an excellent training opportunity for junior team members.

WWTP staff replaced the variable frequency drive (VFD) for the primary tank blower. The VFD enables speed adjustments for the blower, improving energy efficiency. The blower serves the primary grit chamber, which removes solid abrasive materials that could damage downstream equipment.





WWTP staff replaced the bearing for Trickling Filter Gate 2 and removed the shaft due to excessive wear, which will be replaced with a new stainless-steel shaft. Gate 2 enables the alternating of trickling filters between lead and lag positions. Alternating the filters enhances biological water treatment by maintaining a more even distribution of biological growth across the filters.

The carrier bearing on Raw Sewage Pump 1 was braced with additional supports by operators and maintenance staff at the WWTP. This reinforcement reduces shaft deflection, extending the lifespan of the pump's components. The Wastewater Treatment Plant operates five raw sewage pumps: three are electrically driven, and two are dual gas engines with direct drives. The dual gas engines can run on methane or natural gas. Methane is naturally produced during the stabilization of



biosolids, helping to decrease the plant's energy consumption.

Snow Town USA kicked off this year's events with the opening of the Park Circle ice rink. The Snow Town committee was joined by Mayor Sarah Compo Pierce and members of City Council.
