

The City Council meets the 1st and 3rd Monday of each month at 7 PM in the Council Chambers, 3rd Floor, 245 Washington St, Watertown NY. The 2nd Monday of each month is held for Work Sessions, which are open discussions of topics requested by the Mayor and City Council. If there is a holiday on Monday, the Council Meeting or Work Session will take place on the following day, Tuesday. Public is welcome to attend all meetings. City Council Minutes & Agendas are available online and the Meetings and Work Sessions are captured on video by Steve Weed Productions.

Police Academy:




The Black River/St. Lawrence Police

California Avenue North Sewer Replacement

The sewer main on California Avenue North from Bronson Street to Huntington Street needs to be replaced. This project is waiting for approval of the 2025-2026 City Budget.

Central Street Sewer Replacement

The sewer main on Central Street from Bronson Street to Huntington Street needs to be replaced. This project is waiting for approval of the 2025-2026 City Budget.

Leray Street Reconstruction

The City desires to do a full road reconstruction of Leray Street. The Engineering Department has created a request for Proposals for design services for this project, and they are now under review. Once approved, the Requests will be sent out to design firms.
