

Fire Department

Structure fires:

Time: July 22, 2025 at 2131 Hrs. Location: 235 N. Rutland St

Companies Responding: Initial response was Engine 2, Engine 1, Engine 3, Truck 1,

Rescue 1. Chief 3

Additional units that responded to the scene were Engine 5, Squad 1, Squad 2,

BRFD 6-8-1, Fort Drum Engine 1 and Chief 4

Situation Found: Upon arrival Engine 2 confirmed a working structure fire in a 2 story multiple dwelling apartment building. They found heavy fire in a rear stairwell entrance to an upstairs apartment. The fire had worked its way into the attic space and spread. Access to the attic was difficult resulting in the fire progressing to a condition that the operation had to go defensive. The fire resulted in major damage to the structure. There was some heat damage to the neighboring home's siding.

Cause: Under investigation by Watertown FD Investigators

Remarks: Fort Drum FD, Black River FD, GEMS, City PD, National Grid, City Codes all assisted at the scene, Town of Watertown FD and Northpole FD assisted by standing by and covering the city. Jefferson County Dispatched assisted with numerous calls to other agencies.

Date/Time: July 19, 2025 at 0159 Hours

Location: 1149 Temple Street

Responding Units: Engines 1, 2, and 3; Truck 1; Rescue; Chief 3

Incident Summary:

At 0159 hours, the Watertown Fire Department was dispatched to a reported structure fire at 1149 Temple Street. While en route, Jefferson County Dispatch advised that multiple 911 calls were being received reporting the fire. First-arriving Watertown Police Department officers confirmed a working structure fire with downed power lines in the street.

Engine 2 arrived shortly thereafter and confirmed heavy fire conditions involving all areas of the home. All occupants were confirmed to have safely exited the residence prior to fire department arrival.

Due to the advanced fire conditions and extent of structural damage, firefighters conducted a defensive exterior attack. There were no reported civilian or firefighter injuries; however, some household pets remain unaccounted for.

The fire was contained to the structure involved, and no damage occurred to adjacent buildings.

Upcoming Fire Recruit Academy:

Starting on Monday August 11, 2025, the Watertown Fire Department will begin a New Fire Recruit Academy. The department recently interviewed potential candidates, and Watertown FD will be placing 4 recruits in the academy. They will be joined by candidates from Fulton and Victor. We look forward to another successful academy.

Public Works Department

Roads Crew

Buildings and Grounds

Crews are also well underway setting up for block parties in public square. There is a lot of work that goes into this. Crews set it all up and take it down safely!





Electrical

DPW crews have been working on utility locates, special events like the Jefferson County fair and Farmers Market, keeping the cityowned traffic lights/street lighting all functional. For a crew of 3, they sure do a fine job.





Storm Culverts

DPW crews repaired another couple sanitary services. Whether it is broken, clogged, or full of roots, the crew does there best to keep everything maintained. The crews have also been busy cleaning and CCTV as much as they can to keep up on maintenance.





Maintenance Garage

Mechanics are hard at work prepping for winter, maintaining buses, and keeping the several hundred city-owned units on the road. There is no shortage of work in this department.





Forestry

Tree City Watertown requires a lot of maintenance, and the crews are doing very well keeping up.





Water Department

The City of Watertown Pollution Control Facility uses biogas (a byproduct of organic material stabilization) to heat process tanks, operate pumps, and warm buildings. As part of regulatory requirements, the facility must track both the volume of biogas produced and how it is used. To improve accuracy, staff recently installed a new gas meter to monitor the biogas consumption for one of the tanks.





Every summer for the past four years, New York Water Environment Association (NYWEA) has supported the *Work in Water* program, giving high school students the opportunity to earn a summer paycheck while learning about their local water systems and the critical role water infrastructure plays in our communities. This year, the Watertown Pollution Control Facility received enough funding to welcome four high school students into the program. During their time with us, the students gain hands-on experience at both the wastewater treatment plant and the water filtration plant—learning about plant operations, solids handling, lab work, data collection and analysis, and even basic maintenance tasks.

For the second year in a row, the Watertown Pollution Control Facility partnered with DEC Region 6 to host an in-depth tour for summer interns working in the water division. The tour gave future regulators a firsthand look at the full treatment process—from wastewater intake to final discharge—while highlighting key areas like lab work, solids handling, and equipment maintenance. It also provided a valuable opportunity for interns to connect with plant operators, offering real-world insight into the challenges and responsibilities of running a wastewater facility—insight they'll carry into their future roles in environmental protection.



Staff at the Pollution Control Facility recently repaired the fill line for Ferric Chloride, a key chemical used to remove phosphorus during wastewater treatment. Phosphorus removal is essential to preventing nutrient pollution in local waterways. The quick repair helped maintain smooth operations and environmental compliance.

Even during good weather, equipment at the Pollution Control Facility can sometimes become clogged. The grit removal system helps prevent this by removing debris that could damage downstream equipment. Our staff work diligently to keep all equipment running smoothly and efficiently.

Planning

<u>Pro-Housing Community Recertification</u> – Staff has applied and received recertification from the New York State Division of Housing and Community Renewal. It was received on July 14th. The certification allows the City of

Watertown to apply for funds from the \$650 million in the State's discretionary funding programs that are available exclusively to Pro-Housing Communities. This will help the City of Watertown fund future projects and make the city even better for its citizenry.

<u>Stewart's Redevelopment</u>— Staff recently reviewed a redevelopment proposal from Stewart's Shops Corp. to demolish and reconstruct its Fuel/Convenience Station at the corner of Coffeen Street and Massey Street North. The redeveloped location will feature an expanded footprint, including a larger store and an



additional fuel island. The project required a Subdivision, Site Plan Approval, Special Use Permit and two Area Variances. Staff worked closely with Stewart's throughout the process, from a pre-application meeting through Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals approvals.

Parks and Recreation Department

The 208th Jefferson County Fair wrapped up on Sunday, July 20. Since then, Parks & Recreation crews have been hard at work restoring the fields and preparing them for play once again!

The Watertown Red and Black is the oldest semi-pro football team in the United States, having been established in 1896.


