

Planning Department

Tree City USA Application:

Planning Staff has been working with the City Forester along with members of Tree Watertown, (the City's Street Tree Advisory Board) to complete the City's 2025 Tree City USA application to the Arbor Day Foundation. A successful application requires conducting an Arbor Day ceremony, having a tree board or department, having a tree ordinance, spending \$2 per capita and having a

forestry program to plant and care for trees. 2025 was a successful year for the urban forestry program in Watertown as 207 trees were planted, approximately 500 were pruned and 71 were removed. The program's success can be attributed to the partnerships with Tree Watertown, the Watertown Noon Rotary Club, Northern New York Community Foundation,



SLELO-PRISM, NYS Department of Environmental Conservation, National Grid Distribution Forestry, student volunteers from Watertown City School District and Immaculate Heart Central Schools, citizen volunteers and of course the support from City Staff and the City Council. The application was submitted on December 10, 2025. If approved, 2025 will mark the 26th straight year that the City has received this prestigious designation!





Waste Water Department



Cold winter weather can strain outdoor equipment, especially on the open tanks. During a recent cold snap, a drive chain on a solids scraper came off its sprocket, requiring the tank to be taken out of service. Operators and maintenance staff at the Pollution Control Facility responded quickly, made the repairs, and returned the tank to service, ensuring continuous, reliable treatment.



Because of the City's age, portions of our sewer system are combined, meaning stormwater can enter the sanitary system and during heavy rain or snowmelt, the stormwater places an excessive strain on the collection system. To manage this, treatment plant operations staff inspect system relief points at least once a month. These locations are continuously monitored through remote monitoring systems to ensure residents can be notified if an overflow occurs.



Cleaning the digesters requires extensive planning and lots of operational changes at the Pollution Control Facility. One of the biggest challenges is taking the largest digester out of service for cleaning, as it handles a significant portion of the facility's organic material. The remain digesters are each half the size and can't hold the same volume. To prepare, staff modified a transfer pump to allow chemicals to be added to the smaller digester, helping it more safely handle the increased load while the larger digester is offline.

SOLUTIONS IDENTIFIED

Research into a number of problems began during the summer of 2024. While we had hoped to solve these issues quickly, time was needed to determine the best solution that benefited not only our library but the North Country Library System as a whole. These solutions included:

- Migration to a new PC management software (from Libki to Envisionware) - investigation into a new vendor began in July 2024, installation and staff training was complete in February 2025. In addition, Flower staff members continue to test pieces of the software for NCLS IT in an authentic environment.
- Migration of our staff-wide email group to Microsoft completed in July 2024.
- Re-installation of self checkout PCs via a new vendor. Polaris - research began in August 2024, installation and staff training was complete in August 2025.
- Re-installation of a public print management system via a new vendor, Envisionware - research began in September 2024, installation and staff training was complete in August
- · Migration to LX Starter for emailed patron notices with a modern feel - completed in February 2025.

RELOCATION OF STAFF TECHNOLOGY

When opportunities arose to move equipment around and make for a more efficient staff workflow, we jumped at the chance! Examples included:

- Replacement of inoperable search computers with old spares using the USB version of the catalog - ongoing project as equipment fails.
- Replacement of inoperable search computers with two tower/kiosk versions of the catalog as a test for NCLS completed in July 2025.
- Replacement of square monitors from library spares ongoing project as equipment fails.
- · Relocated two staff iPads to circulation for use by catalogers - completed in March 2025.

TECHNOLOGY REPORT

Technology at Flower Library is evolving at a rapid pace! Improvements have been made to both the equipment and software that staff and patrons alike use on a daily basis, which have resulted in a more efficient workflow and a better rapport with our community in the long-run. All users are beginning to understand that with time and patience, the library can provide up-to-date technology that will aide them in getting their tasks accomplished and their goals achieved.

All PCs are first sent to NCLS for repair. Outdated machines are replaced when budgets allow.

In June 2025, as a part of the Broadband Project, staff launched 3 new laptops as available for use inside the library only. Specific checkout rules do apply, but this allowed staff to meet an observed need of our patrons.
