

# PLANNING DEPARTMENT

## Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) Update

Staff completed a draft of the City's 2026–2030 Consolidated Plan and 2026 Annual Action Plan this week and the document is currently available for public review and comment on the City's website: <https://www.watertown-ny.gov/CDBGPublicCommentOpportunities>

To develop the 100 plus page document, Staff conducted outreach to several different organizations and individuals throughout the community, met with the Citizens Advisory Board, Advantage Watertown, conducted an online survey, held a public meeting at Hilltop Towers and discussed the plans at a City Council work session.

The citizen participation and outreach enabled the City to develop a plan that addresses the community development needs of our City. The plan's primary goals are neighborhood stabilization and revitalization, housing rehabilitation and homeownership.

Our 2026 Annual Action Plan includes several infrastructure initiatives including a sidewalk reconstruction project, a sewer replacement project and funding for the replacement of lead and galvanized water services. It also includes a demolition project to address blight, a homebuyer program and support to address food insecurity in our schools and community.

## Volunteer Board Spotlight: Tree Watertown

Tree Watertown was formed in September of 1995 under the leadership of former Mayor Tom Walker, after the devastating Ice Storm of 1991 and Microburst of 1995. Tree Watertown is a volunteer group of community citizens which serves as the Street Tree Advisory Board to the City of Watertown. Tree Watertown advises the City on policy issues, makes recommendations regarding grant applications and serves the community through the development and presentation of educational initiatives and the planting of trees throughout the year.



Tree Watertown members have planned and held numerous educational events over the years, conducted annual Arbor Day observances for the last 28 years, helped develop the Downtown Arboretum and have volunteered to plant trees every fall since 2002. In addition, members have assisted with the Rotary Spring Tree Planting Project, which has been a tradition in the City since the mid-1970s.

Tree Watertown members have been meeting monthly for the past 31 years! Anyone interested in attending a meeting is welcome to do so. Meetings are held on the second Thursday of each month at 4:30 p.m. in the City Council Chamber at City Hall (except during July). The next meeting will be April 9, 2026 at 4:30 p.m. Upcoming events include a celebration of Arbor Day on Friday, April 24 at 12:00 p.m. in Thompson Park and the Rotary Tree Planting which will be held on Saturday, April 25, at 9:00 a.m. on Eastern Blvd.

## Animal Advocacy Day:




For the first four weeks, they have been training in topics such as Civil Liability and Risk Management, Standards of Proof, Electronic Communications, Off-Duty/Plainclothes Encounters, Intoxication, Ethics and Professionalism, and lots of Physical Training!

# FIRE DEPARTMENT

## **March 13th – Jefferson Leadership Institute**

The Jefferson Leadership Institute stopped by the Massey Street Fire Station on their Public Safety Day. We discussed how municipal fire departments operate, reviewed CPR techniques, checked out the fire apparatus and some turnout gear, and toured the station. As always, the JLI crew asked great questions and had some fun with us along the way.



# FIRE DEPARTMENT *continued*

## **Structure Fire:**

In the early morning hours of March 20, 2026, fire crews responded to a reported residential fire. The caller indicated that a fire had occurred in a second-floor bathroom ceiling fan and believed it had been extinguished, but requested that it be checked as a precaution.

Upon arrival, firefighters confirmed signs of fire damage in the bathroom, including a ceiling fan that had fallen and was hanging by its wiring, along with significant charring above the fixture. Crews identified active fire extending into the attic space and quickly worked to open the ceiling and fully extinguish the remaining fire.

Firefighters also took steps to protect the homeowner's belongings and conducted overhaul operations to ensure the fire was completely out. It was noted that the home had a single smoke detector on the first floor that was not activated at the time of the incident. Additional smoke detectors were installed on the second floor and in the basement to improve safety going forward.



# FIRE DEPARTMENT *continued*

## **Structure Fire:**

In the early morning hours of March 23, 2026, the City of Watertown Fire Department responded to a structure fire. Engine Company 2 arrived within minutes to find a two-story residence with heavy fire on the first floor and significant smoke on the second.

The occupant had safely exited the home prior to firefighters' arrival and was transported to a local hospital for treatment of smoke inhalation and minor burns. Crews worked quickly to bring the fire under control, but the home sustained extensive fire damage to the first floor, along with smoke and water damage to the second floor.

Multiple agencies assisted at the scene, and additional departments provided standby coverage while crews remained committed. Firefighters also responded to several other emergency calls during the incident. The cause of the fire remains under investigation.

It was noted that there were no working smoke detectors in the home at the time of the fire, underscoring the importance of having properly functioning alarms on every level of a residence.



# DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS



## **Roads Division:**

As warmer weather returns, the Roads Division has resumed work on the large sidewalk project along Division Street. This project will install new sidewalks adjacent to a park and a school, improving safety and accessibility in an area with high pedestrian traffic.

## **Sewer Division:**

The Sewer Crew recently assisted with the demolition of a gazebo that had been deemed structurally unsound. This project provided an opportunity for the crew to demonstrate their versatility and skill beyond their regular sewer and pipeline responsibilities.



# DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS *con't*

## **Central Garage:**

Two new police vehicles were delivered this week, arriving just in time for the spring season. Crews will complete the necessary inspections and preparations to ensure the vehicles are fully equipped and ready for service.



## **Forestry Division:**

The Forestry Crew has been especially active this time of year, responding to wind-related damage across the City. The impact can be seen in several areas where trees and limbs required prompt removal to ensure public safety. Crews frequently operate bucket trucks at significant heights to safely dismantle and remove hazardous trees. This work demands a high level of skill, teamwork, and attention to safety. Excellent work by the team for their professionalism and dedication.



# DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS *con't*

## **Electrical Division :**

Crews worked to repair traffic signals following extensive wind damage. These signals are critical to the safe and efficient movement of both vehicles and pedestrians throughout the City.



## **WATER DISTRIBUTION**

### **Service Repair:**

Various services across the City have had repairs due to extreme cold temperatures. Since February 1, 2026, 39 water meters have been replaced as a result of freezing. Multiple services have been isolated due to frozen burst pipes or ice dams damaging gas services, leaving the property without heat.

### **Main Break/Leak Investigation:**

Leak studies have been performed in various areas of the city and identified two service leaks that will be repaired or renewed in the coming weeks.

# WATER DISTRIBUTION *continued*

## **Service Replacements:**

One Service line was replaced from the curb stop to the meter.



## **Hydrant Replacement/Repair:**

Staff have replaced two hydrants and repaired three more damaged from use.



# WATER TREATMENT



Phase 2 of lift station emergency generator installation project is nearing completion. Initial startup is in progress at three additional locations, bringing the total to six out of ten lift stations now equipped with emergency power. This significantly reduces the risk of sewage backups during a loss of grid power.



Raw Sewage Pump No. 1, which is methane/natural gas driven, had been leaking. A contractor has since installed a new mechanical seal to correct the issue. This repair will allow the pump to be operated more frequently, resulting in reduced electrical consumption at the Pollution Control Facility.



A giant thank you to Jay Slate and Dakota Goodwill from the Pollution Control Facility for volunteering their time to attend the Watertown High School Science Fair. This type of public outreach highlights the importance of our work and demonstrates to the community and the next generation how important and rewarding a career in water treatment can be.

# WATER TREATMENT *continued*



During ongoing maintenance activities at the Pollution Control Facility, impacts are experienced throughout the entire treatment process. Currently, Primary Digester 2 is being cleaned and inspected, and the Primary Settling Tank requires significant repairs. As a result, increased debris and solids are being recycled through the facility, requiring continuous monitoring and staffing of the headworks to prevent equipment plugging or operational upsets.



The Primary Tank at the Pollution Control Facility contains collectors that move solids towards the suction of the removal pump. One of these collectors was identified as broken. In order for staff to safely enter the tank to repair it, the solids must be removed from the tank. Staff utilize fire hoses to clean the tank.
